

# Descriptive vs. Analytical-

- Descriptive research includes surveys and fact-finding enquiries of different kinds. The major purpose of descriptive research is description of the state of affairs as it exists at present.
- In analytical research, on the other hand, the researcher has to use facts or information already available, and analyze these to make a critical evaluation of the material.

# > Applied vs. Fundamental-

- Research can either be applied (or action) research or fundamental (to basic or pure) research.
- Applied research aims at finding a solution for an immediate problem facing a society or an industrial/business organization.
- Fundamental research is conducted with view for the sake of the knowledge having no intention of its application.

# Quantitative vs. Qualitative-

- Quantitative research is conducted for the measurement of quantity and it is applicable to the work which can be expressed in terms of quantity.
- Qualitative research, on the other hand, is concerned with qualitative phenomenon, i.e., phenomena relating to or involving quality or kind.

### Conceptual vs. Empirical-

- Conceptual research is generally used by philosophers and thinkers to develop new concepts or to reinterpret existing ones.
- Empirical research is based on observations and experience. In this type of research hypothesis is provided and then data is collected to prove or disprove this.
