

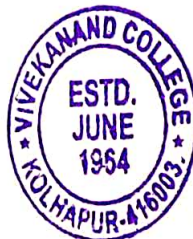

Report of the Seminar

The Departments of Economics and Political Science jointly organized ICSSR sponsored one day national seminar on 'Neoliberal Reforms and Welfare in India' on Saturday, 30th April, 2022 from 10:30 AM to 5:00 PM in the Library Hall Auditorium of the college.

Rationale: India formally inaugurated neoliberal reforms in its economy in 1991. Liberalization of economy in India has persisted steadily but sluggishly. Neo-liberal policies and integration with the world economy have affected social and political life in India variously and deeply. Turn toward markets and corporatization affects the life conditions of workers as citizenry. The welfare function of the State provides the necessary cushion in the economic and social transformation that takes place with liberalization. The social welfare becomes an all the more important aspect of policy and politics when at the same time liberalization is equated with decline of the welfare state.

Objectives:

- 1) To probe into the nature of neo-liberal reforms in India.
- 2) To analyze the impact of neo-liberal reforms on the lives of citizens.
- 3) To contribute to the public discourse on neo-liberal economic policy and the welfare role of the State

- 4) To substantiate the inter-disciplinary dimension in the study of neoliberal reforms and welfare.
- 5) To throw light on the possibility of rational and socially accountable balance in economic and social policy of the State.

Report:

With the above objectives in mind, the seminar was conducted in four sessions including the technical session of the paper presentation.

Inaugural Session: After formal inauguration, Ms. Samiksha Farakate introduced the theme of the seminar. The Seminar was inaugurated at the hands of Prof Gopal Guru, Editor, Economic and Political Weekly. He was also the Key-note Speaker of the Seminar. In his inaugural address Prof. Guru briefly through light on the significance of the seminar theme and the relevance of organizing it in Kolhapur. He emphasized that Chhatrapati Shahu of the former Karveer Princely State combined the economic growth and social justice in his economic and social policy and that he was an emblem of social justice. Hence it is significant that this seminar was organized in his 100th death anniversary year. The inaugural session was chaired by Principal Dr. R. R. Kumbhar. He underlined the support of the institute to all academic efforts and commended the interdisciplinary nature of the seminar. Dr. R. G. Korabu, Head of the Department of Economics in D D Shinde Sarkar College, Kolhapur was also an invitee for this session. Convener Dr. Kailas Patil presented vote of thanks.

Keynote Address: In his keynote address, Professor Gopal Guru who is an authority in the area of political economy of social welfare, first elaborated the theoretical meaning and origin of neoliberalism. He explained the meaning and rationale of 'Welfare'. He illustrated with examples that welfare rights are important for citizens. He then elaborated how the concept of welfare has changed from resource transfer to money transfer in the context of welfare. He ended his speech by elaborating the impact of the changed nature of things on the citizens' wellbeing. Dr. R. G. Karbu gave the chairperson's remarks. Prof. Guru addressed several questions from the audience. Vote of thanks was presented by Mr. Ashish Bhasme.

Session One: In the first session, Prof. Dr. P.S. Kamble, Professor at Department of Economics, Shivaji University, Kolhapur spoke on the topic "Neoliberalism and Welfare". He illustrated through a power point presentation the trends and extent of neoliberal reforms

in India. He used minute data to make delegates aware of specific policy frameworks and their impact. He then defined 'Welfare' and presented the statistics of welfare expenditure in India and the changes therein. Professor Kamble answered participants' questions. This session was chaired by Dr. M. S. Deshmukh who is also Professor at Department of Economics, Shivaji University, Kolhapur. In his chairperson's remarks, he seconded the points made by Professor Kamble and further commented on the nature of liberalization and privatization in India. Vote of thanks was presented by Dr. Y.D. Hartale

Session Two: In this post lunch session, Prof. D. U. Pawar Former Dean of Social Sciences at Shivaji University, Kolhapur spoke on the theme "The Politics of Social Welfare in India: the Current Moment". Prof. Pawar made the session conversational. He made out the meaning of 'social welfare' by asking questions to participants. He then talked about the place of welfare policies in agendas of political parties and how they use the same. He talked on the effect of communalization of politics on the neglect of welfare politics. This session was chaired by Dr. Santosh Yadav, Assistant Professor, Devchand College, Nippani. He briefly commented on the content and style of the Resource Person Dr. Pawar in his address. The vote of thanks was presented by Mr. Sandip Patil.


Technical Session: Nine delegates presented their papers, mostly with the help of PPTs. The papers addressed varied topics from analysis of welfare schemes in India to New Economic Policy. Student researchers of Economics and Political Science presented the papers too. This session was chaired by Prof. H. V. Chame, Head, Department of Sociology, Vivekanand College, Kolhapur.

Valedictory Session: The valedictory session was chaired by Prin. Dr. R.R. Kumbhar who congratulated both the departments on successful conduction of the national seminar and gave wishes for further research and deliberations on the topic. The vote of thanks for the entire seminar was presented by Dr. Kailas Patil, Convener of the Seminar.


Outcomes:

- 2) Various angles of neoliberalism and social welfare were introduced to the participants through speeches and question and answers.


- 3) Papers were written and presented throwing light different aspects of the topic (List attached).

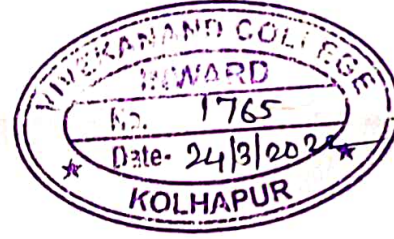

The Sanstha operates 330 education centers across 13 districts of Maharashtra and one district in Karnataka and imparts education to more than 2 Lakh students. Most of the educational centers are located in rural, obscure areas imparting education to the less privileged children. Dr. Bapuji Salunkhe's was awarded D.Lit. by Shivaji University, Kolhapur and the title 'Dalit Mitra' by the Govt. of Maharashtra for his dedicated work and great service to the downtrodden and poor communities of the society. The Sanstha is embracing the new and advanced trends in education under the able leadership of Hon. Prin. Abhaykumar Salunkhe, Chairman, Shri Swami Vivekanand Shikshan Sanstha and Hon. Prin. Mrs. Shubhangi Gavade, Secretary, Shri Swami Vivekanand Shikshan Sanstha.

About the college:

Vivekanand College, Kolhapur which was established in 1964 is known as one of the best quality colleges in Maharashtra. About 8000 students are enrolled every year for various programmes. Neo-liberal policies and integration with the world economy have affected social and political life in India variously and deeply. Turn toward markets and corporatization affects the life conditions of workers as citizenry. The welfare function of the State provides the necessary cushion in the economic and social transformation that takes place with liberalization. The social welfare becomes an all the more important aspect of policy and politics when at the same time liberalization is equated with decline of the welfare state. In this context, it becomes necessary to probe into the nature of neo-liberal reforms in India, their impact and the nature, content and impact on the lives of citizens.

The seminar aims to contribute to the public discourse on neo-liberal economic policy and the welfare role of the State in the context of their interaction and inter-relation. This is an attempt to substantiate the inter-disciplinary dimension of this issue. Though its independence is valued, economic policy cannot separate itself from social and political accountability and on the other hand, too much politicization of welfare policies creates challenges for economy and democracy. The seminar aims to throw light on the possibility of rational and socially accountable balance in economic and social policy of the State in the context of neo-liberalism.

The turn toward liberalization in the 1980s has been explained variously, including in terms of the changes in coalition of the dominant classes, that is changing nature of the social character of the State. Neo-liberal reforms do not pertain only to economic policies but imply changes in the organization and functioning of State institutions to align them to market rationality (Joseph 2007). The problems faced by developmental state in the world and India created legitimacy for the neo-liberal reforms in the economic sector. On the other hand, democracy is believed to be linked to the welfare demands which create pressure of the resource capacity of the state.
