# 5. Words Matter: Language as a Tool for Social Change

#### Introduction

The Department of English at Vivekanand College, Kolhapur, has been actively involved in an Educational Outreach Program in partnership with AVANI NGO since the academic year 2018-19. This ongoing initiative aims to provide underprivileged children from marginalized communities, such as sugarcane-cutter migrants, with access to quality education. Through collaborative efforts with AVANI, our students and faculty members engage with these communities to teach language, literacy, and creative expression, focusing personal growth and social awareness in both the children and the volunteers.

The program encompasses teaching activities at sugar schools (*Sakhar Shala*) and Brick yard (*Vitbhatti*) schools, which serve children from disadvantaged backgrounds, including migrant families of sugarcane-cutter workers. By conducting a systematic educational input, the program not only improves the children's language skills and academic prospects but also empowers them to dream beyond their present circumstances.


### **Objectives**

- 1. 2018-19: Teaching at Sugar School: (Click to view report)

The "Teaching at Sugar School / Sakharshala" program was conducted by teachers and B.A. III (Special English) program students from January 31 to February 13, 2019. The program aimed to raise awareness about the challenges faced by underprivileged children of sugarcane-cutter workers, whose migratory lifestyle disrupts their educational opportunities. Through engaging and empathetic teaching using "Fun N Learn" techniques, the students improved their public speaking and presentation skills while imparting knowledge to the children. The success of the program was largely due to support from Avani, an NGO, and the sugar factory, providing a conducive environment for the students and faculty. The students gained a profound sense of fulfilment, acknowledging their own privileges and developing compassion and responsibility toward society. They appreciated

the program's meaningful work, which highlighted the importance of education and their families' efforts to provide them with stability. The success of the program encourages similar initiatives for future community engagement and awareness.






## 3. 2020-21: Social Outreach Programme (Click to view report)
